Livestock Rules and Guidelines

- 1) As a Junior, FFA, 4-H or Independent exhibitor, compliance with the following rules, and All State and Local Rules, is a condition for exhibiting at the Santa Clara County Fair. Your signature on your entry form signifies your compliance with all Santa Clara County Fair rules.
- 2) Non-Market classes in Junior Livestock are open to all youth, as defined in the State Rules, from the following Counties: Santa Clara, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Monterey and Alameda. Market animal classes are open only to youth from Santa Clara, Santa Cruz and Monterey counties.
- 3) **All Livestock exhibitors must also submit an entry in Junior Stills. Failure to enter a Junior Still project will result in ineligibility to show animal, receive any premium monies and participate in Auction. Stills projects MAY NOT be purchased – they must follow Stills guidelines.**
- 4) **NEW TB REQUIREMENT: ALSO SEE SEPARATE LETTER FROM THE STATE OF CA REGARDING THIS...on website.** Exhibitors must provide proof of tuberculosis testing for all dairy breeding cattle over six (6) months of age with one of the following documents:
 - a) Signed documentation from a licensed accredited veterinarian of a negative TB test obtained within the sixty (60) days prior to exhibition of all dairy breeding cattle to be sold, or
 - b) Signed documentation from a licensed accredited veterinarian of a negative TB test obtained within six months prior to exhibition of all dairy breeding cattle for exhibition only, or
 - c) Signed documentation from a licensed accredited veterinarian of a negative whole herd test for the animal's herd of origin (i.e., the herd where the animal has resided for a minimum 4-month period of time immediately prior to the exhibition) obtained within the twelve (12) months prior to the exhibition, or
 - d) A letter from CDFA verifying the completion date of a negative whole herd test for tuberculosis and specifying the official identification for exhibition animals from the herd.

Verification of TB testing documentation should be accomplished prior to unloading of exhibition animals on the fair premises. The original TB documentation must be available at the time of check-in.

- 5) All sheep and goats must pass a vet check upon arrival at the back of the fairgrounds before they are allowed to go to their assigned pens. Market sheep and market goats must have a scrapie tag to pass the vet check. Dairy goats are allowed to have an ear tattoo for scrapie in lieu of a tag. The ownership papers must reference this registration number.
 - a. *This is a federally mandated requirement; no exceptions will be allowed. The decision of the appointed vet on the health of your animal is final; no appeal is possible.*
- 6) All livestock animals must be owned by the exhibitor; there are only two exceptions:
 - a. Horses entered ONLY in the Riding Classes (English, Gymkhana, and Western) may be leased
 - b. In the rest of the Livestock Department the term 'ownership papers' will be used to reference Bills of Sale and/or Leases, unless otherwise specified. Leased horses are accepted at State Fair; leased goats are not allowed at State Fair.
- 7) A bill of sale or a lease (ownership papers) must contain the following information:
 - a. Name and Address of both the Buyer/Leasee and the Seller/Lessor
 - b. Animal identification (description, eartags, ear notches, tattoos, etc.)
 - c. Date of Birth
 - d. All sheep and goats must have scrapie ID numbers and the animal must have a matching scrapie eartag.
 - e. Dairy goats are permitted to have ear tattoos in lieu of an eartag.
 - f. The ownership papers must reflect the scrapie ID number. The Bill of Sale for all cattle must be on California State Form commonly known as the "yellow sheet"
 - g. Each Market Animal must have its own individual Bill of Sale clearly showing ownership by the Exhibitor.
 - h. If a registered horse is leased, the lease must be a legal lease with the association where the horse is registered.

All Market Animals are subject to the following rules

7. **A copy of all proof of ownership paperwork (bill of sale, brand inspection certificate, etc.) must be presented with entry form for all market animals. Failure to provide proof of ownership before the day of the show will prohibit the animal from being shown or sold at auction – No Exceptions.** Bill of Sale must include breeder name, address, phone number, and scrapie tag information, if applicable) Original ownership paperwork must be surrendered at weigh-in.
8. Market animal classes are open to Santa Clara County, Santa Cruz County and Monterey County YOUTH ONLY. All entries must meet the requirements as outlined in the Junior Livestock Auction section of this entry book. All market animals must be owned by the exhibitor; leases are not allowed.
9. All market beef must be owned 120 days prior to the receiving day at the Fair; the bill of sale must be dated 04/01/10 or earlier. All other large market animals entered must be owned at least 60 days prior to receiving day at the Fair; the bill of sale must be dated 06/02/10 or earlier. All small market animals (rabbits and poultry) must be owned 30 consecutive days prior to receiving at the Fair; the bill of sale must be dated 07/01/10 or earlier.
10. Market and feeder animal exhibitors shall be responsible for having animals weighed at the Santa Clara County Fair. Only one weigh-in allowed. Any question of weight must be resolved while animal is on the scale. All market animal classes are to be determined after weigh-in; classes are to be determined by weight only.

All *non-market livestock animals* are subject to the following rules:

- a. Horses must be leased or owned 120 consecutive days prior to the receiving day of the Fair; ownership papers must be dated 04/01/10 or earlier.
- b. Dairy animals must be owned 60 consecutive days prior to the receiving day of the Fair; ownership papers must be dated 05/30/10 or earlier.
- c. Breeding animals: Santa Clara County requires the 60 day ownership period, the same as for dairy animals. Exhibitors must present all necessary papers to the clerk in charge, at the Livestock Office no later than 24 hours prior to judging. State Rules regarding breeding partnerships apply.

Pre-Fair Tagging & DNA Sample – REQUIRED!

11. All Market cattle must be brought, with their original Bill of Sale and an entry form, to the Pre-Fair tagging being held at the **Fairgrounds on THURSDAY, April 1, 2010, from 4PM to 7PM**. At that time, the Bill of Sale will be examined and copied, an electronic picture of the animal will be taken and a sample for possible DNA testing in the event of a later eligibility question. Please enter from Umbarger Road and follow the signs for tagging.
12. A pre-tagging event will be held Thursday, June 3, 2010, for Market Sheep, Swine and Goats at the Fairgrounds- from 4pm – 8pm. **ALL** requirements as stated in the Market cattle tagging (above)will apply.
 - a. The tagging place will take place in the infield area aka “Livestock Area” as it did last year. Please make certain that you have all your paperwork with you when you bring your animals.
13. **FAILURE TO HAVE YOUR ANIMAL PRETAGGED WILL PROHIBIT YOUR ANIMAL FROM BEING ENTERED IN THE 2010 SANTA CLARA COUNTY FAIR – NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE!**
14. Failure to provide acceptable proof of ownership at the time of pre-tagging will prohibit the animal from being shown and/or sold at auction – **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

During the Fair

15. Any animal treated while on the fairgrounds, whether by Veterinarian, owner or individual; **MUST** be reported immediately to the Livestock Dept. Supervisors. Vet bills for all sick or injured animals are the responsibility of the exhibitor.
16. Any substance given to a Market Animal while on the fairgrounds must be reported to the Livestock Office prior to administering to the animal. Substances include but are not limited to herbs, “calming” substances, aspirins, over the counter medications. This is a reporting requirement and will assist the exhibitor in ensuring that the Market animal is given substances that will be acceptable by the Slaughter House.
17. All stalls and pens **MUST** be cleaned daily, with old bedding put into designated areas by 9:00am daily.
18. The Junior Exhibitor must do all grooming of their animal(s). No professional or adult help is allowed other than leaders or advisors who may hold animal while exhibitor works. Fair Management may approach exhibitors if a violation of this rule is reported. No artificial coloring of animals is allowed except on hooves and horns.
19. All FFA and 4-H exhibitors are to abide by the uniform requirements of their organization while showing their animals. Independent exhibitors are urged to wear a white blouse/shirt and white or black pants.

20. No animal, product or article on exhibition can be removed from the Fairgrounds before the announced time. Junior large animals will be released at 7:00pm on Sunday, August 8, 2010 unless otherwise stated. It is the exhibitor/parent/advisor's responsibility to make arrangements for livestock to be picked up at release time. All displays must be left intact until release time.
21. All beef cattle and dairy cattle must have a neck rope and a halter on at all times.
22. Exhibitors will be held responsible for damage they cause to any Santa Clara County Fairground's facility or equipment.
23. No Junior Exhibitor will be allowed to sleep with their animals.
24. All animals must be bedded with shavings, except Dairy Cattle (straw is the responsibility of the exhibitor). Shavings must be commercial quality. The Fairgrounds will not provide shavings for bedding.
25. In accordance with State Rules, No animal shall be admitted or remain on the grounds that shows any evidence of any active, communicable disease, or any other unsightly disease or other condition. No animal shall be admitted to the fairgrounds from any other premises under quarantine for disease. Management reserves the right to require health inspections and/or diagnostic tests before, during and after animals are on the fairgrounds and to implement disease control procedures as deemed necessary. The health of animals when determined by the official veterinarian or judge will be final and cannot be protested! Specific details regarding check in of animals will be distributed mid July.
26. Exhibitors refusing to have their animals examined shall be disqualified and such violation shall be reported to the State Fairs and Exhibitions Department. No refund will be made.
27. **NO ANIMALS ALLOWED OUTSIDE OF LIVESTOCK AREA!** Except those that have qualified for Parade of Champions.

Junior Auction Rules

1. Open-bid participation in the Santa Clara County Fair Livestock Auction is open to market animals exhibited, judged and owned by Santa Clara County resident exhibitors ONLY.
2. Santa Cruz and Monterey County exhibitors may sell one animal through the Santa Clara County Fair if they have a prearranged buyer.
 - a. The exhibitor must provide the Fair with a certified check for the designated animal and fill out the appropriate paperwork prior to the AUCTION DEADLINE of NOON, August 6, 2010.
 - b. Sale price of the animal must be for at least the current market price.
 - c. The purchase price must include the processing fee and any other charges normally associated with the sale.
 - d. The exhibitor will also be subject to the 4% service fee charged to all exhibitors that sell an animal.
 - e. The exhibitor will not participate in the auction.
 - f. All other Junior Auction Rules still apply.
3. HOWEVER...if an out-of-county exhibitor has a Champion or Reserve Champion Market Animal the animal MUST go through the Auction and be subject to the open-bid process. This exhibitor may sell a second animal as long as the exhibitor complies with the aforementioned and has a prearranged buyer and certified check as stated.
4. Animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction must be entered into the Auction by noon, Friday, August 6th, 2010 in the Junior Livestock Office. No scratches or substitutions will be allowed.
5. ALL EXHIBITORS SELLING ANIMALS THROUGH THE AUCTION WILL BE REQUIRED TO VERIFY THAT THEIR ANIMAL IS FREE OF DRUG RESIDUE, BY SIGNING A DECLARATION FORM FOR THE ANIMAL ENTERED INTO THE AUCTION. Drug withdrawal times for all medications given to all market animals must be strictly adhered to. Any animal that tests positive to any medication at the time of slaughter will be held at the Slaughter House until resolution and disposition. THE EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL COSTS INCURRED.
6. All animals entered into the Auction will be sold for processing. There will be no live animal sales at the auction. Small animal processing is the responsibility of the Seller.
7. All market animals sold through the Auction will be marked or tattooed, to ensure that they will not be shown again.
8. All Champion and Reserve Champion lots must be sold. Exhibitors with animals other than Champion and/or Reserve Champion will be allowed to one animal or meat pen per exhibitor. Out of County Exhibitors are subject to the above guidelines referencing the sale of their market animals.
9. Santa Clara County Exhibitors winning Champion and/or Reserve Champion are eligible to sell one other animal at Auction.
10. Animals must appear in the Sale Order as listed, and at the proper time, or they will not be sold. EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR GETTING THE ANIMALS INTO SALE RING AND TO HOLDING AREA ON TIME, AND FOR RETURNING ANIMALS TO PEN AFTER SALE.
11. Sale animals may not be altered from standard fitting and showing condition. Champion and Reserve Champion banners are acceptable, as approved by Management.
12. OWNER/EXHIBITORS ARE STRONGLY URGED TO BE PRESENT AT THE AUCTION WHILE THEIR ANIMAL IS SOLD. IF EXHIBITOR CANNOT BE PRESENT, LEADER OR INSTRUCTOR MUST CONTACT THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK OFFICE. It's the exhibitor's responsibility to locate a substitute to take their animal through the Auction.
13. All Club and Chapter members selling animals are required to be in official uniform at the time their animal is sold. Independent exhibitors are urged to wear white shirt/blouse and white or black pants.
14. OVERWEIGHT MARKET ANIMALS: Top end weights are as follows: Sheep (150 lbs.); Swine (270 lbs.); and Beef (1350 lbs.); Goats (120 lbs.). Animals exceeding top weights will be allowed to show and sell if meeting standards. Overweight animals will sell at top weight limitation, and not be paid for excess of that limit
15. If the Slaughter House condemns carcass, it is Seller's responsibility to refund the Buyer's Money.

16. A 4% Sale Commission will be charged on all animals sold. Funds derived are used for bookkeeping, auction brochure, auction supplies, equipment, auctioneer and other such costs.
17. No awards, speeches, or decorations except those designated by Fair Management, will be given during the Auction or in the Auction Ring.
18. ORDER OF SALE: Poultry, Rabbits, Hogs, Beef, Sheep and Goats.
19. Only Market Animals placed in Market Groups 1 & 2 are eligible for Auction.
20. **Sale will begin at 10:00 am on Sunday, August 8, 2010** – champions will be sold at beginning of each species. Animals will be sold individually, except meat pen rabbits and chickens.
21. Completed Auction paperwork must be submitted to the Livestock Office by Noon on Friday, August 6, 2010.

Livestock Showmanship Rules

Entry forms due: June 18, 2010, postmark accepted
Entry Fee: \$1.00 per entry per class
Judging: See Individual Species for dates and times, American form of judging will be used. Rosettes to 8th. place.

Rules & Guidelines:

1. All Showmanship classes must be pre-registered on an official Fair entry form.
2. Only animals shown by the exhibitor in Junior Department Livestock classes listed in this book are eligible.
3. California State Fair Junior Livestock Competitions: check in the Livestock Office for the California State Fair Junior Best of Show Competition Entry Forms and Rules and Guidelines.
4. Showmanship classes will be broken into groups as follows:
 - a. 4-H Beginning Showmanship – Exhibitors who are 13 years of age or younger, who have never won a first place ribbon in Showmanship in that livestock category at the Santa Clara County Fair. Places 1st, 2nd and 3rd may enter Novice Showmanship this year. All ribbon winners except 1st place will have the option to move to Novice the next year or remain in Beginning (precluding Novice age rules). If the 2nd or 3rd place winner should win Novice, he/she would then follow the Novice rules.
 - b. 4-H Novice Showmanship – Exhibitors who are 14 years of age as of January 1 of current year or older who have never won a 1st place ribbon in that category of livestock at the Santa Clara County Fair and exhibitors 13 years of age and younger who have won 1st place in Beginning Showmanship in that category in previous years. Places 1st, 2nd and 3rd may enter Advanced Showmanship this year. All ribbon winners except 1st place will have the option to move to Advanced the next year or to remain in Novice (precluding Advanced age rules). If the 2nd or 3rd place winner should win Advanced, he/she would then follow the advanced Showmanship rules. The winners of the Novice Showmanship classes will compete in the Novice Master Showmanship Contest.
 - c. 4-H Advanced Showmanship – Exhibitors of any age who have won at the Novice or Advanced level in previous years or any who have chosen to move up to the Advanced level. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners from this years Novice level may show in Advanced. The winners of Advanced Showmanship will compete in the Advanced Master Showmanship Contest
 - d. FFA Novice Showmanship - Exhibitors who are showing this species for the 1st year ever. Project starting no sooner than September 1st of the preceding year. The winner may compete in FFA Novice Master Showmanship; top three place winners may enter Advanced Showmanship this year and
 - e. FFA Advanced Showmanship - Any FFA member who has shown in previous years and the top three winners from this year's Novice Showmanship Classes. The winner of Advanced Showmanship classes may compete in the Advanced Master Showmanship Contest.

Livestock Herdsmanship

American System of Judging

No fees or premiums

Sponsored by the 4-H & FFA Fair Awards Committee to encourage cleanliness.

This is a special contest conducted by the 4-H & FFA Fair Awards Committees. Starting on Tuesday, at least once each day a group of leaders or parent volunteers will walk through the livestock area. They will judge each 4-H Club and FFA Chapter on the cleanliness and appearance of their assigned pen areas. Daily scores will be combined to determine overall rankings throughout the run of the Fair from Tuesday through Saturday afternoon. Overall and Species awards will be presented at a combined 4-H and FFA Awards Ceremony held on Saturday evening.

Rules:

- All pens, including tack areas, must be cleaned by 9 am daily. Judging may take place any time between 9 am and 5 pm, and by noon on Saturday. Judging will be done on show days.
- Each species will be judged in it's own category and there will be an overall club species winner. The 1st place clubs in each species will be able to choose their pen assignments for next year's fair.
- Exhibits will be judged with the following criteria:

* for cattle, change to 2 pts for tied securely and give 2 pts. to the presence of a monitor.

* for swine, on Tuesday only, change to 4 pts for a clean animal and 3 points for a monitor.

Stall Space at the Fairgrounds

Stall space will be limited. If you desire stall space please note this on the entry form. This notation does not guarantee space as it will be awarded on a first come, first served basis. It will however, help us to be aware of the numbers that we may need. Horses stabling at the Fair must remain until release on Sunday August 8, 2010. All exhibitors' horses not being stabled at the Fair are allowed to trailer in but must be checked in one hour before the start of judging on the day of the show. Exhibitor must check in with the Horse Show Supervisor in the show area. Note that 4-H and FFA are Combined classes, except for Showmanship.

Light Horse Rules & Guidelines:

1. All State, Local, Livestock and State Horse Show Rules apply. Specific rules are per USAEF Show Rules (Gymkhana – CGA rules apply).
2. State Rules require a \$5.00 drug fee for each horse entered.
3. All Horses, owned or leased, must be in the Exhibitor's name at least 120 days prior to the Santa Clara County Fair; the ownership document must be dated on or before 03/30/2010. See State Rules regarding ownership.
4. Note: a leased horse cannot be shown for conformation in the Horse Halter Show.
5. Only current year stallion foals may be handled by a Junior.
6. National Horse Breed Association Registered Purebred animals cannot be entered as a grade or unregistered animal.
7. Registered animals must have original registration papers only (no photocopies) naming the exhibitor as the owner.
8. Grade animals require a notarized bill of sale or notarized statement of ownership naming the exhibitor as the owner. Original ownership papers (no photo copies) for Half-breed, Appendix, Pink-Papered, & Breeding Stock I.D. must name exhibitor as owner to be accepted into Section 103.
9. Leased horses agreements must be notarized.
10. All registration papers and notarized statements must be checked no later than one hour before the start of the show.
11. Random testing of horses is possible. If a drug has been given to your horse for any reason, within 72 hours of the show, a drug declaration must be filed with the horse show supervisor.
12. Shavings only may be used to bed stalls. All soiled bedding should be disposed of in the areas provided.
13. Horses on the fairgrounds may be ridden by owners only.
14. Horses may be checked for soundness upon arrival. The fair staff and Livestock Committee may make a determination as to soundness and can dismiss from the grounds any horse deemed unable to perform or where it is in the best interest of the horse.
15. Mares with foals at side cannot be stalled together in one stall, due to safety.
16. All horses with injuries (lameness) that have occurred prior to the Fair can have those animals examined at the owner's expense but not at the expense of the Fair. All horse exhibitors are responsible for their own veterinarian expenses.
17. For the entire run of Fair, Exhibitors are required to care for, prepare for showing and show their animals.
18. A horse or pony may be shown by one exhibitor only.

19. Adult help (including leaders, parents and trainers) in grooming, exercising and preparing for show, including lessons or instruction and/or coaching from the rail during a class, at this show may cause the member and/or animal to be disqualified. (Disqualification consists of withholding ribbons or awards, elimination of further competitions and removal from the fairgrounds). Adult help is limited to safety related situations. Instructions from one member to another is permissible.
20. Any violation of 4-H, FFA, County Fair, or State Fair Rules will be grounds for immediate disqualification from all shows, and will result in loss of all awards and points toward the end of the year awards program and the privilege to participate in any further Horse Shows for the entire current show year.
21. All FFA and 4-H exhibitors are to abide by the uniform requirements of their organization while showing their animals. Independent exhibitors are urged to wear a white shirt/blouse and white or black pants.
22. All junior exhibitors must have "on ground" supervision by a responsible adult.
23. Pony height shall be under 14.2 hands. Horses are to be 14.2 hands and over. Exceptions: Registered Arabians, Half Arabians, Connemaras, Morgans and Paso Finos.
24. TWO-MINUTE GATE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. A five- (5) minute tack change will be allowed upon request.
25. Tiedowns, running martingales, bareback pads, mechanical hackamores, etc. are prohibited, with the exception of Gymkhana classes, in which mechanical hackamores, tiedowns and martingales are acceptable and jumping classes where standing martingales only may be used. Excessive use of any type of whip will be severely penalized.
26. LUNCH BREAKS – No set time.
27. Safety approved hard hat with harness strap in place must be worn whenever mounted anywhere on the fairgrounds.
28. State Fair Qualification – FFA, 4-H and Independent exhibitors will be entered into the same classes but will complete only against those in their respective organizations. The highest placing individual from each organization in each class will qualify for the California State Fair Horse Show.
29. Exhibitors entered into a Walk/Trot class cannot cross over to a canter class. Walk/Trot classes limited to beginner riders or 1st year green horse/pony, must not have shown prior to current year. Horse/Rider combination limited to one year only.
