Animal Entry Rules and Guidelines

Please read all Local Rules and Guidelines and the Exhibitor Code of Conduct found on pages 8-10.

Entry Requirements

1. Enter one species of animal per entry form. Duplicate entry forms as needed.
2. **All animal exhibitors must also submit a Junior Still entry.**
3. Showmanship is an individual entry on your form. Exhibitors must pre-register for Showmanship separately on entry form, including leg band, tattoo number or ear tag for animals that will be used.
4. Separate entry forms must be used for Poultry Divisions, Pigeon Divisions and Rabbit and Cavy Divisions and must be filled out completely.
5. Exhibitor is responsible for correctly entering their animal- breed, variety, age and sex. If mistakes are found, Department Supervisor will transfer the animal to the correct section/class, if possible.
6. Exhibitor Age Requirements
 - a. Grange and 4-H Exhibitors must be 5 years old or in kindergarten as of January 1, 2010 and a resident of Santa Clara County to enter Market classes.
 - b. Independent Juniors must be age 9 or older as of January 1, 2010 .
 - c. All youth showing Large Animals must be 9 years of age or older as of January 1, 2010.
 - d. 4-H and FFA Exhibitors will follow their organization's membership rules.
7. On Receiving and/or Judging day, exhibitors should enter through Gate F off Umbarger Road, unload in the Livestock Area where designated and then park in lot B.
8. Animals entered in Market classes cannot be entered in any other class except Showmanship.
9. All clubs and chapters will be required to have at least one exhibitor in attendance in Expo Hall, the small animal area, Thursday - Sunday, to greet people, answer questions and demonstrate aspects of animal care as well as safeguard the animals. Clubs and chapters may choose to collaborate and cover specific periods of time or days – a schedule should be turned into the Fair Office no later than Wednesday, August 4th.
10. Use Market Entry Form for Market Classes only – all other classes use Small Animal Entry Form. Forms are located in the back of the book.
11. AUCTION DEADLINE: Noon on Friday, August 6th, 2010. YOU MUST BRING YOUR COMPLETED AUCTION PAPERWORK TO THE LIVESTOCK OFFICE BY THE DEADLINE.

Responsibilities and Expectations

12. Market Animals going through the Auction MUST BE KEPT at the Fairgrounds.
13. ALL ANIMALS LEFT AT THE FAIRGROUNDS ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR.
14. There is NO Fair staff to supervise animals.
15. All other animals will be received, judged and may be left on the grounds only with Management approval. Otherwise they will be released on the day shown.
16. Exhibitors are encouraged to exhibit small animals throughout the “public” fair days. Cages will be available in Expo Hall.
17. Cage decorations must not prevent airflow to any cage and must be out of reach of animals.
18. Owners are responsible for ensuring that their animals' cages are securely fastened. Animal Owners will supervise securing of cages and will provide pliers and hog ring crimpers.
19. Owners are solely responsible for the feeding and care of their animals.
20. When bringing animals to the Fairgrounds, exhibitors should enter through Gate F off Umbarger Road, unload in the Livestock Area where designated and then park in lot F.
21. Rabbit and Cavy exhibitors are responsible for their animals arriving at the judging tables on time.
22. Exhibitors are required to wear long sleeve white shirts when carrying animals. 4-H and FFA must wear appropriate organization uniforms.

23. All animals must be identified by appropriate/approved method prior to arrival at the Fair. Fair does not supply leg bands.
 - a. Rabbits – ear tattoo *Note that any duplication of ear markings by exhibitors in the same class must be eliminated per ARBA regulations.*
 - b. Cavies – ear tattoo or ear tag
 - c. poultry & pigeons – plastic, numbered leg bands
24. No grooming of any entries (rabbit or poultry) after 9:00 a.m. on judging day.
25. A judge may excuse any animal from competition if it appears fatigued or out of condition. A judge may excuse a rabbit from competition because of temporary curable disease or parasite.
26. Exhibitor is responsible for checkout of Small Market animals, Turkeys, Chickens and Rabbits, and for arranging slaughtering and delivery of animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction.

FFA & 4-H Poultry

Please note: Due to California State veterinary guidelines all fair poultry will be inspected by a Certified Poultry Inspector in a designate area before being released to participate in the show. Any bird found to have an unwanted condition (disease or pests) will be excused from participating; any bird found to have a severe disease will be quarantined until seen by a State Veterinarian.

 Market Poultry that will be entered in the Auction must be remain at the Fair until after the Auction on Sunday, August 8th. Auction entries will be released on Sunday, August 8th – 6:00 p.m.

Rules & Guidelines:

- Competition must exist between two or more first place birds owned by two or more exhibitors before Championship Rosettes will be awarded.
- Best Female Bird will be selected when there are ten or more entries in each of the Large Chicken Classes.
- Rules, definitions and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association shall apply except in such instances where they are in conflict with the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture. California State Rules apply.
- All birds must be owned by the exhibitor at least 60 days before fair, except meat pens, which must be owned 6 weeks prior.
- At check-in there shall be no more than four birds per carrying cage. All birds must be contained in boxes with ventilation.
- Exhibitor shall NOT be allowed to carry birds individually.
- All small animal exhibitors must submit a Junior Still exhibit in order to compete.

Rules & Guidelines:

- Limit: Two entries per exhibitor per class.
- Entries will be judged on uniform size, weight, cleanliness, yolk color, consistency of white/albumen and overall appearance.
- One dozen eggs must be submitted in an egg carton.
- Egg cartons must have a 3 x 5 card taped to the outside lid with the following information. Exhibitor Name, Club, color, Size of Eggs, Section and Class.

- Competition must exist between two or more first place birds owned by two or more exhibitors before Champion Rosettes will be awarded.
- No exhibitor may receive over 60 premium awards in more than 10 varieties or Waterfowl.
- Birds must have standard plastic numbered leg bands with numbers conforming to entry form or day of receiving. Leg bands are to be provided by exhibitor.

Market Poultry

Rules & Guidelines:

- American System of Judging
- Only exhibitors ages 9 and above may enter market classes, including poultry and rabbit meat pens.
- Chicken pens are two birds of same age, breed and sex cooped together.
- Championship and Reserve Championship meat pens will be chosen and must be sold at the Junior Livestock Auction. All other market group 1 and 2 meat pens may be sold at the Auction if the exhibitor so chooses. An exhibitor can sell only one ribbon meat pen. Refer to Junior Livestock Auction Rules, see page 57.
- All birds going through Auction must remain on the Fairgrounds after judging. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to care for the animal. This rule is subject to availability of suitable size cages. Final decision regarding the appropriate size of cage and availability is in the Fair Office.
- Chickens must be a minimum of 42 days old and a maximum of 70 days old.
- Minimum weight for each chicken should be 6 pounds, not to exceed 11 pounds.
- Deadline for Auction Sign-ups is Friday, August 6th, at NOON.
- Meat pen birds may not be entered in any non-market class.
- Owners will be asked to remove any bird(s) that cannot stand to eat or drink on their own.
- Limit: One market turkey per exhibitor.

- American System of Judging
- All birds will be judged in accordance with the latest standard adopted by the specialty clubs of America. Where no American Standard is in vogue, the latest European Standard will be used. Only recognized colors shall be considered in “Any Other Color” classes.
- All young birds must be identified by a serially numbered, current year, seamless leg band of correct size, conforming to the entry form or arrival form at the show. Old birds must have either seamless or split prior year, serially numbered bands conforming with the entry form.
- Birds will be shown and judged in the proper Section and Class for breed, variety, age and sex only.
- A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition.

- American System of Judging
- Please read all State and Local, Livestock and Auction Rules in this book.
- Leg certificates and show reports will be mailed.
- Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the guidebook and standards of the American Rabbit Breeder's Association, Inc. (ARBA) shall apply to Santa Clara County Rabbit Show, provided they do not conflict with any rules and regulations prescribed by the document of Food and Agriculture. Please see the California State Rules.
- Any individual having attained nineteen years of age on or before August 2, 2010 is not eligible to show in an ARBA Sanctioned Youth Rabbit and Cavy Show. See State Rules.
- All animals must be identified by permanent ear markings conforming to the entry form on arrival at the show. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same class must be eliminated per ARBA regulations.
- Entry forms must be filled out in their entirety including daytime and evening per ARBA regulations.
- Animals will be shown and judged out in the proper Section and Class breed, variety, age and sex only. If no section is offered, no awards may be made. Please indicate color of rabbit on entry form.
- No rabbit under 3 months of age will be allowed in regular classes. Cooping of obviously pregnant does or does with litters will not be allowed.
- Substitutions in the same breed, sex, class and variety will be accepted; all changes, including tattoo information must be received by noon on Wednesday, July 21st, 2010 .
- Champion and Reserve Champion meat pens will be chosen and must sell in the Junior Livestock Auction. All other blue ribbon meat pens may be sold at the Auction if the Exhibitor so chooses. An exhibitor can sell only one blue ribbon meat pen. Refer to the Auction Rules.
- All animals signed up for Auction must remain on the fairgrounds and the exhibitor is responsible for all care. This rule is subject to availability of cages. Final decision in this regard is the Exhibits Office.

Entry Instructions: In the interest of the show, the Section will be determined after the entries are received. On entry form, list the breed or variety by name and enter appropriate age class and animal information. If there are not enough animals entered to create a Section, those animals will be put in the AOB Section per Fair Management and State Rules.

FFA & 4-H MARKET RABBITS

Rules & Guidelines:

- All State, Local and ARBA Rules apply.
- Champion and Reserve Champion will be chosen in 4-H and FFA.
- Entry will consist of 3 animals, all of the same breed and variety. Entry will be disqualified if more than one breed or variety are in the same pen.
- Age limit: not over 10 weeks of age.
- Maximum weight of each rabbit not to exceed 5 pounds.
- All animals must be owned at 60 days prior to the beginning of Fair and in exhibitor's possession 30 days before the Fair.
- Limit – 3 entries per exhibitor.
- Meat pen animals may not be entered in any other class except Showmanship.
- Exhibitor will be allowed to sell market group 1 and 2 meat pens in the Junior Livestock Auction. Limited to one meat pen per exhibitor unless the exhibitor has Champion and Reserve Champion pens. Market animals are allowed in the Junior Livestock Auction only for Santa Clara County Residents unless they qualify as Champion or Reserved Champion pens OR if exhibitor has a pre-arranged buyer and a certified check from the buyer to cover the auction price and fees. Refer to Junior Livestock Auction Rules.
- Deadline for Auction Sign-Ups is at NOON on Friday, August 6, 2010 .

- Ear changes will be accepted until Wednesday, Jul 21, 2010, at 4:00 p.m.
Substitutions in the same breed, sex, class and variety will be accepted. NO substitutions will be accepted after July 21st ,
- Exhibitors are responsible for their own animals feed and water on this day.
- Showmanship classes will be first, followed by Cavy Judging. Entries must be made on an entry form.
- All sections and class numbers must be specified on entry form.
- Breed – Variety – Color- Descriptions
 - Selfs – AV (beige, black, blue, chocolate, lilac, red eyed, orange, red, white)
 - Solids - AOV (brindle, dilute, golden, silver, roan)
 - Marked – AV(broken color, Dalmatian, Dutch, Himalayan, tortoise shell, white)
 - Agouti, - AV (dilute, golden, silver)

Entry Instructions: In the interest of the show, the Sections will be determined after the entries are received. On entry form, list the breed or variety by name and enter appropriate age, class and animal information. If there are not enough animals entered to create a Section, those animals will be put in the AOB Section per SCCF Management and the State Rules.

- Danish System of Judging
- Please read all State, Local and Livestock Rules in this book.
- Highest level of obedience classes to be judged first. A lunch break will be taken at the Judge's discretion. Showmanship to follow obedience.
- This show is open to any 4-H member who is enrolled in a regular 4-H Dog Project or Guide Dog Project in Santa Clara County. All dogs must be owned, co-owned or leased by exhibitor.
- Judging and scoring will be based on AKC regulations with 4-H modifications. Judges' decision is final. THIS IS NOT AN AKC SANCTIONED SHOW
- All exhibitors should show in the traditional 4-H uniform (white shirt & pants or skirt, green tie or scarf and a white or green 4-H hat)
- All dogs should be trained by exhibitor.
- All dogs must be groomed by exhibitor. Dogs should not be left unattended on grooming tables or left in cars.
- Management recognizes that each dog and handler qualifies for specific classes and, therefore has no minimum or maximum number of entries required to maintain the availability of classes.
- Uncontrolled or aggressive dogs will be excused from competition. Any member caught abusing or neglecting their dog(s) will not be allowed to compete and will be brought before management for appropriate action. (see Code of Conduct Rules, page 10)
- Bitches in season will be judged in obedience after the regular classes
- An exhibitor may exhibit more than one dog in obedience but each dog is limited to the class(es) it is eligible to compete in.
- All members will be required to clean up after their dog(s).
- Exhibitors are encouraged to enter both obedience and showmanship classes.
- Obedience Class Placements: Danish System of Judging - Those receiving scores as follows will be awarded the appropriate award indicated: Sub-Novice A & B, Graduate Sub-Novice A & B, Novice A & B, Graduate Novice, Open and Utility.

1 st group – blue	190-200 points
2 nd group – red	170-189 points
3 rd group – white	less than 170 points
Qualifying Score	170 points

Section 730: Sub-Novice Obedience (all exercises on six-foot leash; heeling, figure eight, recall, stand for examination, long sit one minute, long down three minutes) Dog has never received a qualifying score in Sub-Novice Obedience at any obedience competition (4-H or other) before. No CD dogs to be entered in this section.

1. Sub-Novice A – 1st year exhibitor and 1st year dog in project
2. Sub-Novice B – all other sub-novice exhibitors

Section 732: Novice Obedience (heel and figure eight on lead, heel free, recall, stand for examination, long sit one minute, long down three minutes) Dogs that have received one qualifying score in Graduate Novice or Open Obedience at any obedience competition (4-H or other) must enter Graduate Novice or Open Obedience.

1. Novice A – this is the only dog exhibitor has trained. Dog or exhibitor has not received more than 2 qualifying scores in Novice at any previous Fair.
2. Novice B – all other Novice exhibitors.
3. Novice C – Clover exhibitor

Section 733: Graduate Novice (heel on lead, stand for examination, heel free, figure eight, drop on recall off lead, long sit three minutes and long down for five minutes with handler out of sight) Dogs that have received two qualifying scores in Graduate Novice at any previous Fairs or dogs that have received a qualifying score in Open at any obedience competition (4-H or other) must enter Open Obedience.

<p>Guide Dog Puppy Play Time</p> <p>Puppy Play Time is a special event for all Guide Dog Puppies entered in the above show. Exhibitors sign up upon arrival for their Guide Dog Show with event coordinator.</p> <p>Rules & Guidelines: Judging will take place on the lawn immediately following Guide Dog Show. All dogs must be entered and shown in the regular Guide Dog Class to be eligible to compete. All exhibitors should be in full uniform with dogs groomed.</p>

Rules & Guidelines:

- All puppies will be shown on a flat collar.
- Puppies must be at least 4 months of age and have had all of their shots.
- Any 4-H Puppy Raiser, age 9-19, that is currently enrolled in the Santa Clara County Guide Dog Project is eligible to show.
- If a 4-H Puppy Raiser wishes to enter, but does not currently have a puppy that they are raising, their leader may provide a puppy for them.
- All participants will be expected to compete in an obedience ring and on an obstacle course. A short questionnaire may be used, in conjunction with either the obedience ring or the obstacle course or to break a tie.
- All Puppy Raisers may participate in the Puppy Playtime activities.
- Exhibitors should show in the traditional 4-H uniform (white shirt & pants or skirt, green tie or scarf and a white or green 4-H hat).
- This Guide Dog event will be run under the direction and discretion of the Guide Dog County Leader.

Rules & Guidelines:

- American System of Judging
- Small Animal Exhibitors may list two (2) animals on their entry form, but may only show one of the two animals in Showmanship. Both animals must be entered and shown in regular judging classes.
- All Showmanship classes must be pre-registered on an official entry form.
- Only animals owned, fitted and shown by the exhibitor on Junior Department classes, or required to be shown in showmanship.
- Any animal that is disqualified due to weight, at time of weigh in, is still eligible to be shown in showmanship.
- Animals removed from their exhibit cages or pens, must be returned immediately following the completion of showmanship.
- California State Fair Junior Livestock Competitions: check in the Livestock Office for the California State Fair Junior Best of Show Competition Entry Forms and Rules and Guidelines.
- Showmanship classes will be broken into groups as follows:
 - 4-H Clover Showmanship – Exhibitors who are 5 years to 8 years of age
 - 4-H Beginning Showmanship – Exhibitors who are 13 years of age and younger, who have never won a first place ribbon in Showmanship in that species category at the Santa Clara County Fair. Places 1st, 2nd, and 3rd may enter Novice Showmanship this year.
 - 4-H Novice Showmanship – Exhibitors who are 14 years of age and older as of January 1, 2010, who have never won a first place ribbon in this category of livestock at the Santa Clara County Fair and exhibitor 13 years of age and younger who have not won a first place ribbon in Novice Showmanship with that species at the Santa Clara County Fair. Additionally any exhibitor from the 2009 Fair, Beginning Showmanship group who competed in 2009 at the Novice level, must now enter Novice Showmanship (or Advanced Showmanship if required). First place, second place and third place ribbon winners may enter Advanced Showmanship this year.
 - 4-H Advanced Showmanship – Exhibitors are of any age, who have won a first place ribbon in Novice Showmanship of this species in prior years at the Santa Clara County Fair. Additionally, any exhibitor who has exhibited in prior years' at the Santa Clara County Fair at the Advanced level, must show in the Advanced Showmanship group. The first place winners of the Advanced Showmanship classes will compete in the Small Animal Master Showmanship Contest (formerly called the Round Robin contest) and must be willing to let their animals be used in the Small Animal Master Showmanship Contest..
 - FFA Novice Showmanship – Exhibitors who are showing this species for the 1st year ever. Projects starting no sooner than September 1st of the preceding year. Top three winners may enter Advanced Showmanship this year FFA Advanced Showmanship – Any FFA member who has shown in previous years and the top three winners from this year's Novice Showmanship Classes.
